## **Program Notes**

Here at **Cherry Creek Chorale** headquarters we believe in the principle of truth in advertising. If we title our concert *Joy Around the World*, we mean it. I had a lot of fun plotting a route on a world map through all the different countries represented in our program, coming out with sort of a meandering spiral. You can do the same this evening when you get home, a nice way of revisiting all the great music that you just heard.

We've drawn a number of our selections from a suite of carols arranged by the great Karl Jenkins titled *Joy to the World*, and he goes on a pretty dizzying journey himself. You can be very sure that Jenkins is never going to be satisfied with a few tweaks here and there if he does an arrangement. I won't list all of his pieces we're singing but will urge you especially to listen for what he does to the African-American carol *Go, Tell It On The Mountain* and to the very British *We Wish You A Merry Christmas.* That second one is a real challenge; watch the tenors' and basses' mouths as they navigate his tongue-twisting syllabifications. His other arrangements include music from Germany, France, Spain, and the West Indies.

But the Jenkins arrangements are only a part of our journey tonight. There's more British and American music to be heard. There are two versions of the angel's words to Mary at the Annunciation: a Russian one, **Bogoróditse Dévo**, and the standard Latin text **Ave Maria**. We'll visit the Catalan region of Spain with two carols about birds. (Yes, **Riu, Riu, Chiu** is a birdcall, although there's some disagreement about which bird it is.) Pablo Casals, the great Catalan cellist, made **Carol of the Birds** famous by ending his concerts with the piece; we welcome our own cellist tonight to add beauty to the arrangement we're performing. France is the source for **O Holy Night**, interestingly enough. I've always thought of it as Italian, haven't you?

The Middle East then beckons with our performance of two Israeli pieces performed in Hebrew: a Hanukkah prayer, *Al Hanissim*, and a haunting love song, *Erev Shel Shonim*. And then it's on to the Pacific, where we'll learn how to say "Merry Christmas" in one of the many languages spoken in the Philippines. The next stop is Australia, with its own take on *Jingle Bells*. And now we have to go all the way around the horn of Africa and up through the Atlantic to Cuba, the source of our rousing performance of *Porque Dios Ha Nacido*.

We're joined in this performance tonight by our own small group, **the CherryTones**, and also by the wonderful **Denver Children's Choir** and their director. Be sure to read about these groups elsewhere in the program. With that, we invite you to come with us on this wonderful journey!

She was chosen to lead the South Dakota Elementary Honor Choir in 2018, the Delaware Children's Honor Choir in 2014, and Denver Public School City-Wide High School Honor Choir in 2023. She enjoys traveling, walking her dogs, spending time with her grandchildren, and doing puzzles.
